Model United Nations General Assembly

On Friday 24th November Ms Yarham and Mr Rowlands took 20 Year 12 students to take part in this year's **Model United Nations Competition**.

This is a fantastic event which requires students to take on the role of the UN. The aim of the day is to develop students' research skills, their debating skills, and increase their awareness of global events. In addition to this, there are prizes available for the best contributions.

The Judd School sent four delegations representing Canada, Indonesia, Pakistan, and Vanuatu. In addition, we had students taking on the role of the Chair Person in the Committee on Indigenous Peoples' Rights, a press team, and a secretariat team.

Our teams of students performed very well. Several received 'honourable mentions' from the judges. **Hal Quigley** from Year 12 won the overall MUNGA Trophy. In the words of the organiser, "Hal could go straight in and manage the United Nations General Assembly". We're obviously delighted for him, especially as it is quite something for the secretariat to win, not a delegation.

Student Investor Champs Go State Side:

In May 2017 'The Underdogs Team', consisting of **Hamza**, **Ollie**, **Sam** and **Stephen** beat off competition from 10,000 other students to become national Student Investor Champions. Their prize for being the best young investors in the country was an all-expenses-paid trip to New York!

During the October Half Term 'The Underdogs', accompanied by Mr Rowlands and Alison Pask the Director of Education at the London Institute of Banking and Finance, visited New York to accept the prize.

'The Underdogs' had a packed five-day schedule in the Big Apple.

Day 1 was a VIP visit to the New York Stock Exchange as guests of Asset Management TV. The team were interviewed live from the floor of the



New York Stock Exchange before witnessing the opening of the exchange. The boys took to their roles as hot shot investors like ducks to water!

In the afternoon the boys were given a private tour of the American Museum of Finance by the CEO of the museum. They were allowed to see the first American Government Budget (not usually available to the public) – which was for \$7million, and balanced by the way!

The following four days were given over to Apprentice style 'treats' for

the team. This included an open top bus tour of New York, a guided bike-ride of Central Park, a speed boat-ride around the Statue of Liberty, dinner at the top of the World One Tower, and much more!

iGEM Success


Judd were successful in producing the first state school team to enter the international competition, iGEM (which stands for the International Genetically Engineered Machine). Ten members of the team travelled to Boston

on 9th November and presented their project, IonIron. They competed against over forty high school teams from around the world and were judged by the same criteria as the hundreds of undergraduate and overgraduate teams to attain a medal. After a fantastic weekend at the Giant Jamboree, they came away with a Silver Medal and awards for "best mathematical model" and "best education and public engagement". They were also nominated for "best wiki". This was a phenomenal achievement considering they were advised that they probably would not win anything the first time through.

Sporting Successes

Congratulations to our **Senior rugby players** for reaching the last 8 in the country in the National Cup, for the second year in a row. This remains the furthest we have reached in the U18 competition.

Cross Country

Following last year's selection for the World Schools' Athletics Championships, the school are delighted and proud to be selected to represent England again, this time at the World Schools' Cross Country Championships. A team of 6 Senior athletes will compete against countries from all over the world in Paris this Easter. This deserved selection is based on years of consistent high success in the sport, and particularly for our current Y11s who dominated the National Final last winter.

The Senior squad continue their unbeaten season in the main trophy races with strong wins at Guildford, St Albans and Hampton. Our strength across the year groups was proved by a mixed team retaining the Judge Cup at Tiffin.

The Juniors put in a great performance to win the Regional Final of the Schools' Cup, at Vizards, while the Intermediates came up against very strong opposition and didn't make the final that we won last year. The Juniors didn't run to form in the final, save for George Hopkins who looks better with every race; the team were placed 17th in the country.

The Kent League saw a total of 58 Judd boys and 1 girl compete and for many it was their first competitive outing. More opportunities will follow in the new year. Junior Running Club on Wednesday after School is the first place to go if boys are interested in getting involved.

The Seniors now will consolidate their training in readiness for the first of the season's 'majors', the **Senior Knole Run on Saturday 13 January**. Come and cheer the boys on in Sevenoaks from 2:30pm!
