## Sporting Success

It is a great testament to our sportsmen and women and the PE and Games Department that we were ranked one of the best state schools in 2015 for sport. Two years ago the school was tenth in the national rankings, but is now **second** in School Sport magazine - a new high! The list is taken from sporting achievements throughout the year in 120 national competitions across 20 different sports, including athletics, rugby, tennis and cross country. In 2015 Judd were national junior cross country champions and 2nd in the athletics national finals. The senior cross country team won the Matthew Grant Cup at the prestigious St Albans Relays. In Rugby, not only did the U15 A team win the Kent Cup for the second year in succession, but the U14s also qualified for the finals, a stellar result. There have also been fantastic wins recently for individual performances in judo, tennis, table tennis and sailing, which must also be congratulated.

Well done to all the coaches and students alike. Your enthusiasm, passion, strength and determination has clearly been rewarded and we look forward to more of the same in 2016!



Congratulations to the DNavigate team, led by Mrs Andrews, who won the prestigious Rolls-Royce Science Prize for their inspirational teaching project. Mrs Andrews, accepted the prize on behalf of the whole team at the awards ceremony held at the Science Museum in London.

Taking as its premise the importance of DNA technology for addressing major global issues, 'DNavigate' (a community project) inspired passion and enthusiasm in the students for science, enhanced their communication skills and raised their awareness of ethical issues around the subject.

The competition started in 2014 with over 2000 entrants nationwide. The DNavigate project was shortlisted to one of a final nine early in 2015, then following judging during the summer, had to wait until November to find out the results.

Mrs Andrews said: "This has been a fantastic experience with great outcomes: academic attainment was increased amongst the participating students and an awareness of the potential of this exciting topic raised to both students and the public. We're passionate about this project and winning the Rolls-Royce Science Prize means that it can continue and grow."
