Dear Parents/Guardians

We are delighted that you have decided to accept your child's place with us at Judd. Our aim is to ensure that the transition runs as smoothly as possible.

First day of term: Wednesday 4 September 2019 – 10.30am arrival

Year 12 students are requested to arrive at school for a 10.30am start on the first day of term and 08.40am on normal school days (apart from Mondays when school starts at 10.10am). Year 12 will be greeted by Sixth Form Prefects at the gates and will be taken to the School Room for a welcome assembly. **Please also be reminded that there is to be no access to the site for dropping off/picking up for parents at any time.**

The first day of term is an unusual day, not least as it is a Wednesday – our Senior Games day. There will be an induction programme in the morning and then an opportunity to sign up to a variety of different sporting options that afternoon – all year 12's will be required to select an option for the term. **Year 12 should bring a sports kit on the first day of term.** You can wear any appropriate sports kit for this, you do not need a specific Judd sports kit. If you are picked to represent the school for a sports team, the Head of PE will advise you of what you will need.

Induction trip to Bewl Water: Tuesday 17 September 2019

Each year we run an induction trip for Year 12s. These trips are well established and create an opportunity for the students to further develop friendships with their peers. Our School's Timetable - a 58 Period Cycle

The Judd School has a two-week timetable, with six periods each day. However, on Mondays we reduced the school day by one period per week for students, in which all teaching staff undertake a combination of department or pastoral meetings and CPD activities on a published cycle. In order to maximise the efficiency and productivity of this session, and minimise its impact on the many and varied after school activities - as well as afternoon games and fixtures, it was decided that this one period must occur at the start of the school day, requiring students to arrive for a later start, as opposed to an early finish!

Over the past years that this has been in operation, the additional time on a Monday morning to prepare for the week ahead has been very well received. The benefits to the school to have that time together as a whole staff have been enormous too. We are aware that a number of students find it difficult to arrive in school for a later start; as such, we provide a supervised study session on Mondays from 8:40am or younger students and sixth formers can use the Sixth Form Study Room until the start of the day.

Weduc Parental Portal & App

Students and parents will receive an email shortly after the start of term, with further details on how to enrol for the parental portal, where they will be able to view school reports and other useful information. This is our chosen method of communication with parents/guardians and we ask that you check the portal regularly for school information and news. You will also be able to view copies of school reports, timetables and school news there.

Reporting Absence

Regular attendance at school is essential to students' learning and progress so they perform successfully in all areas of school life. We record attendance using class registers which must be taken, as a legal requirement, twice a day. In addition, subject teachers take a register for each lesson. Sixth Form students are allowed to leave school from 13.05pm should they have no more taught lessons that day.

Absence from school

All absence must be reported to school by 9.00am on each day of absence, either by sending an e-mail to absence@judd.kent.sch.uk, by using the Weduc parental portal/app or by leaving a message on the 24 hour telephone answer service 01732 770880, explaining the reason for absence (**not via the 'enquiries' email address or a note in the planner please**).

The school must be informed of any foreseeable absence e.g. for unavoidable medical appointments or music exams outside school; It is essential that students sign out when leaving the school premises and then sign back in when they return before the end of the school day.

It is the student's responsibility to catch up on the work they have missed due to illness or any other reason. Only where students are absent for a prolonged period of time would we send work home. Often this is most efficiently done by a friend sharing class tasks and homework daily, rather than receive lots of separate messages.

Punctuality

Form Registration takes place at 8:40am Tuesday to Friday and at 10:10am on Monday. Afternoon registration is at 12:10pm, during Period 4, Monday to Friday. Students arriving late must go to the School Office to sign in and provide a reason for lateness.

Year 12 Induction Trip - Tuesday 17th September 2019

I hope that your son/daughter is looking forward to joining the Sixth Form at Judd in September. We know from experience that the cohorts that achieve the best and get the most out of their sixth form experience are those that settle quickly into their new routine, develop strong relationships, are happy and support each other. We aim to facilitate this for both our existing students and the new Year 12s by taking them on a team building day to Bewl Water Outdoor Centre. The students will be accompanied by the Sixth Form team, their form tutors and some support staff. Bewl Water Outdoor Centre is KCC accredited and such team building days are well established.

Travel: By coach, leaving Judd at 08:30 hrs and arriving back at approximately 17.15 pm on Tuesday, 17th September. **Emergency contact on the day:** The Judd School – 01732 770880

Food: Your son/daughter will need to bring a packed lunch and some drinks/snacks for the day. The school has a number of students with nut allergies so please note that we operate a 'no nuts' policy.

Clothing: Students will need three sets of clothes:

1. a set to travel in
2. an old set of comfortable, practical clothes and shoes for the activities (they could turn up in these if they wish, as long as they bring a clean set to travel home in)
3. an additional set of comfortable, practical clothes and footwear that will potentially be going into the water plus a towel, an anorak or equivalent are essential.

There will be time at the start to change out of their clean clothes and at the end of the day to change in their clean clothes to travel.

Equipment: if students choose to bring valuables (phone, camera, iPod, etc.) they do so at their own risk, and the school will not be responsible if these items are lost or damaged. There will be lockers provided but they are not secure. Students could bring their own padlock if they would like.

Charge: £40.00 – this is available to pay on **Parent Pay**, the school's new online payments system. **On Wednesday 4th September** you will receive an activation email from Parent Pay. Due to the tight timescale, please could you activate your account and pay promptly and by **Monday 9th September** at the latest. Should you feel unable to meet the full cost of the trip please write in confidence to the School Business Manager, Mrs Clare Morey (CMorey@judd.kent.sch.uk), as we do have the Lawrence Atwell Fund that we can use for certain cases.

We would really appreciate your co-operation with this as we have two large induction trips in September/October and getting these forms in early will help to manage the workload.

The Induction Day will involve a series of team building activities, including some water-based. If your son/daughter would prefer not to take part in water activities, he/she can repeat the land-based ones; please indicate this on the medical form.

Furthermore, there have been changes to data protection rules following the introduction of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR). By consenting for the trip, you are giving permission to the school to share personal data regarding your child (name, age, gender, allergies, dietary, medical information and other relevant information) with our providers. It is a necessity for the safe organisation of the trip and we are contractually bound to do so. Consequently, failure to agree will unfortunately mean that your son will be unable to participate.

We look forward to welcoming you in September. You will receive a letter in the first week of term confirming the final details of this trip.

Online Payment System – Parent pay

With effect from July 2019, the school's online payment provider has transferred to Parent Pay, an established and widely used service to schools. Upon joining the school, the primary contact (logged as number one on the application form) will be sent via e-mail to your chosen contact e-mail with details of the registration process. If you are an existing Parent Pay user, at either Judd or another school you can add your child to your existing account using these login details. Emails will be sent on the 4th September to allow you to register and we politely ask that you do so as soon as possible to allow you to make payments to the school for the Induction trip and School Fund donations and any other payments to the school during your time with us. We do not accept cheques and so your support with this is much appreciated. If you need more than one Parent Pay account, please contact the Finance Office who can help set this up for you.

Independent Catering

Independent Catering is the **FRESH FOOD** caterer at your school offering varied menus using fresh U.K. meats, fresh salads and vegetables every day from our local suppliers.

A cashless payment system, sQuid – see below, is operated reducing the problems of cash in the school and encouraging healthy eating.

Payment is made online using a debit or credit card. This credit balance is debited each time a student purchases food items from the cafeteria at breakfast, mid-morning break and lunch.

A maximum daily spend limit of £6.00 is set (please email us at info@independentcatering.co.uk, should you wish to have a different daily limit) however an average daily spend is estimated at £3.00 per day. A main meal and dessert is £2.30.

Breakfast: Yoghurts, cereals, hot breakfast rolls, fresh fruit, toast, hot & cold drinks.

Morning Break: Freshly made sandwiches & rolls, hot filled breakfast muffins and toasties, hot filled panini breads, fresh fruit, hot & cold drinks.

sQuid – Cashless Catering

Independent Catering provide an online school meal payment system via **sQuid**. This will enable you to see balances, purchases and credits.

Squid is a new way for you to top up your child's school cashless catering account online. Account application is FREE and there is no charge for payments made by debit card.

Your child will be issued with his/her cashless payment registration letter card on the first days of term. Please ensure you provide him/her with some cash, so they may purchase items until you have received your letter, registered and topped up the card.

When you have received the relevant letter, please register your details with sQuid and create an account by following the instructions on the letter. If you already have a child with a sQuid account in another school or Judd, you will still have to register your additional child/children but you can use the same password and security question/answer - just use a different username (your child's name preferably).

Music at Judd

At The Judd School we are keen to encourage and support our students in the widest possible range of musical activities, both within and beyond the usual curricular music lessons. Many pupils are involved in musical activities on a weekly basis. These include 4 Choirs, 2 Orchestras, String Orchestra, Wind Band, Brass group, Samba Band, Big Band, and Rockistry (an after-hours rock school). Regular concerts are given throughout the year. There are occasional small-scale concerts and a house music competition at which pupils of all ages are invited to play. Membership of all choirs, ensembles and orchestras is open to **all** pupils of the school, whether or not they have music lessons in school. The music practice rooms and the recording facilities can be used with permission by both rock groups and classical ensembles.

Fees are **£175.00** for ten half-hour lessons (Half a term's notice is required, in writing, to terminate lessons) payable to the individual peripatetic teacher. Some instruments are available for hire from the school at a charge of *£50 per term*, and advice can be given on purchasing an instrument, in some cases through the school.

OJ Community

It will give your child access to hundreds of Old Juddians who may be at their chosen University, working in an industry where they might want some work experience, conversations about career choices, come back and guide the new intakes of Judd students or simply offer or receive job opportunities!

Judd Parents' Association (JPA)

We have a vibrant and busy parents association supported by parents from all year groups. CCF

The CCF (Combined Cadet Force) at Judd is made up of two sections – RAF and Army. We meet on Fridays after school from 15.45 to 17:30 and aim to give an insight into the services as well as offering opportunities to develop leadership skills.

Each section normally recruits from Year 9 and Non Commissioned Officer Cadets (NCO) who conduct the training are drawn from Year 12 and 13. Those who join in Year 12 are put on an accelerated programme with the intention that they become NCOs themselves.

You will have the opportunity to join in field days, weekend exercises, .22 shooting, flying (RAF), NCO leadership training, adventure training at Easter and Summer camp. You will also be able to apply for courses.

If you are interested in joining, or would just like to know more, please speak to one of the NCOs from the section of your choice, or to one of the Section Officers when you arrive in September. Sqn Ldr C. Lawrence is i/c RAF and Lt McCafferty is i/c Army.

School Fund

As a school we continue to offer an extra-curricular programme which is the envy of other state schools. With ever-shrinking central budgets it is harder and harder to do this, but we succeed through the generosity of staff (giving their time and skills for free) and parents (making donations to the School Fund). The money we receive from central Government is used to pay for the core education that your son/daughter will receive: staff salaries, text books, exam fees, utility bills, maintenance to name just a few. So much of what the school is proud of, beyond the academic successes of our students, is in those things not covered by this money.

The School Fund, therefore, supports these activities through funding competition entries, special equipment, achievement awards for students, musical instruments, clubs and societies, trips, coaches and minibuses, as well as supporting publication of the annual school magazine, The Juddian, which celebrates such activities.

We suggest a voluntary contribution of £60 per student, annually, which can be paid via standing order, the form can be [printed](#) and sent to school. Please return completed standing order forms to the school's Finance Department, not direct to your bank.

As a school with charity status it is also a very tax-efficient donation, by completing the [Gift Aid form](#), we can receive money additional to your donation (if you are a UK taxpayer). You can also claim tax back, if you are a higher rate tax payer, through your tax return.

Should anyone wish to donate more or less any funds are welcome.
