Summer Results Highlights

A Level:

- over 400 results were graded A* or A almost two thirds of all results.
- 87.9% of all A level entries were graded A*. A or B.
- half of students gained AAA or better.

At GCSE:

- more than half of all entries were graded A*, 8 or 9 for the sixth year in succession.
- 90% of students achieved their EBacc of the required suite of subjects.

New Building work well underway!


