 - 32 students gained places at Oxbridge
 - 87.7% of all A level entries were graded A*, A or B.
 - 47.5% of students gained AAA or better **At GCSE:**
 - more than half of all entries being graded A*, 8 or 9 for the fourth successive year.
 - 90% of all students achieved 5 A grades or better.

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Judd School to compete on the International Stage

The Judd School is the first UK state school to enter the prestigious international competition in synthetic biology, iGEM, and to present at the Jamboree in Boston, USA. In doing so, they aim to pave the way for further UK schools to follow.

Synthetic biology is underpinned by the iGEM competition and the components (BioBricks) that the teams make each year. These are held in a BioBrick 'Registry of Standard Parts' and a full set are sent out to the competing teams each year. The goal of new teams is to assemble existing BioBricks in novel ways, as well as create their own BioBricks which help build the Registry. iGEM started in MIT in 2003 and came down to high school level six years ago.

By entering the competition this year, Judd aims to inform more UK schools about this field and make the way easier for future UK schools to follow. Part of the competition is to raise awareness of synthetic biology and iGEM. The team are doing this in a number of ways, including running a club for students in the lower part of the school and by liaising with other schools.



I will be running a quiz night to raise awareness and funds for the team, so look out for a date in the diary soon! We wish them all the best for the Jamboree in November.
